Keith Krause is Professor of International Relations at the Graduate Institute in Geneva, and Director of its Centre on Conflict, Development and Peacebuilding. He has recently edited a volume on political violence (forthcoming, CUP), as well as *Armed Groups and Contemporary Conflicts* (Routledge, 2010). He is an author of numerous articles on violence and human security. He was a Rhodes Scholar and completed his DPhil studies at Balliol College. His research interests include the changing character of contemporary armed violence, and multilateral security cooperation. He is also Programme Director and founder of the Small Arms Survey, an internationally-recognized research NGO that is the main source of information and analysis for international public policy on small arms and armed violence issues.
