

LEIDEN – PARIS – OXFORD

MA in *EUROPEAN HISTORY & CIVILIZATION*



Leiden University, Université Paris I – *Panthéon-Sorbonne* and the University of Oxford offer this Master's Programme - under the auspices of the **EVROPAEVM**, an active association of leading European universities - leading to an *MA in History* validated and awarded by Leiden University, together with an official *Certificate* from the Europaeum association.

This one-year programme is divided into trimesters, with the first trimester of teaching at Leiden, the second at Paris I, and the third at Oxford, including four weeks for tutorial guidance in the preparation of a dissertation. In each part of the programme, candidates select modules from a range of topics, and are thus able to tailor the course to their specific interests and requirements. In Oxford, all students are affiliated to one of the University colleges.

A course designed to help you excavate the hidden roots of European identity over 500 years.

The programme aims to provide participants with a special opportunity to deepen their knowledge of *European History and Civilization*, to discover the 'inside story' of Europe's historical development via nationhood, revolutions, divisions and wars, finally towards peace and the European Union.

Participants gain from the extensive networking facilities offered by study at three leading higher-education institutions in Europe—two on the European continent, the third in the English-speaking world. The programme also actively stimulates contact between participants, local institutions, and intellectuals and alumni, thus bridging three academic communities.

Tuition fees at Leiden, Paris I-Sorbonne and Oxford (including the additional Oxford College fees) amount to up to € 8,000. Fees for non-European students are much higher – in the order of €16,000. The first deadline, especially for international students who need visas and arranged housing is: March 30, 2011. The final deadline is 30 May, 2011.
